

Instructions for Poster Presentations at ENVIRON 2020

Thank you for offering to give a Poster Presentation at ENVIRON in Dublin City University, April 27th to 29th 2020. Please follow the guidelines below for preparing and submitting your presentation.

Guidelines for Poster Presenters.

- The poster presentation area is in the Foyer of the X Block of the Glasnevin Campus. When you arrive at the registration desk, please indicate that you have a poster for presentation and the staff at the desk will direct you to the poster presentation area.
- Posters can be erected on Monday Evening April 27th or on Tuesday morning, April 28th.
 All posters should be in place by 11 AM on Tuesday April 28th. Please do not remove posters until the end of the final poster session on Wednesday morning.
- There will be three poster sessions during the colloquium. To ensure the colloquium delegates can meet the poster presenters, poster presenters must be present at their posters for these sessions to answer any questions.
- Each presenter is assigned a unique poster ID number (please check the Delegate Handbook given to you at registration). Your poster should be mounted on the poster board assigned to your ID number.
- Each poster is assigned to one of the following themes; posters from each theme will be located in the same area:
- Water Quality and Resources
- The Food-Energy-Water Nexus
- Wastewater and Water Reuse
- Waste Management
- A Cleaner Energy future: Energy Production & Storage Options
- Climate Change
- Invasive Species
- Environmental Management, Policy and Communication
- Human Health and the Environment
- Ecotoxicology

- Air Quality and Urban Development
- Marine and Coastal
- Sustainable Transport
- Sustainable Infrastructure and the Built Environment
- Sustainable Land Use, Agriculture and the Food Industry
- Biodiversity and Ecosystems
- Technology and the Environment
- Ireland 2050 A Resilient Society living within Planetary Boundaries

Student presenters should be aware that a competition is run by the ESAI for the best student poster. The winner will be invited to submit an article on their research project to the ESAI Website and the ESAI E-Zine 'Environews' and will also receive publicity from their sponsor. The prizes confirmed to date are below with more specialist categories to follow:

 The ESAI Best Poster Presentation (€250) sponsored by the Environmental Sciences Association of Ireland (ESAI)

Poster Preparation

- Posters should be no larger than A1 (594 x 841 mm) and must be portrait in orientation.
- Posters should provide the name of the presenter(s) and their affiliation and contact details.
- Posters should include a short description of the research theme and methods used as
 well as results and the current status of the research as well as the expected
 outcomes/output.
- Pictures, photographs and diagrams may be included.
- It can be useful to bring some A4 printouts of your poster to hand out.
- Poster presenters are encouraged to include on their poster a website address (URL) where ENVIRON delegates can find further information about their research. The URL may be in text or QR code format. A QR code is particularly useful as delegates with smartphones can scan the QR code on the poster to link directly with the relevant web site.
- Free QR code generators may be downloaded from websites.
- The image can then be transferred in jpeg format (or similar) directly to the poster before printing or alternatively, it could be printed on a sticker for placing on an existing poster.

Poster Presenters doing a 1 minute oral presentation should adhere to the following guidelines

 At on-line registration stage poster presenters have been invited to do a 1 minute oral presentation.

- The oral presentation should be one slide only. We will not accept more than 1 slide.

 The one slide should <u>not</u> be one poster!!
- Do not exceed the 1 minute allocation the 1 minute time will be strictly enforced.
- The single slide should contain no more 5-6 bullet points.
- The single slide presentation should be sent to Anne Morrissey at anne.morrissey@dcu.ie
 by Thursday April 23rd. We will not accept presentations after this date or presentations handed in at the colloquium.
- Files should be in Microsoft Office format. Please test your files for viruses before submitting.
