



Instructions for Poster Presentations at ENVIRON 2020

Thank you for offering to give a Poster Presentation at ENVIRON 2020 jointly hosted by Dublin City University and ESAI from October 20th-22nd 2020. Please follow the guidelines below for preparing and submitting your presentation. The switch to presenting online may be a little daunting but please be assured that your poster presentation will receive ample opportunity to be viewed during the event and that technical support will be available should you need it.

Guidelines for Poster Presenters.

- You are encouraged if you haven't already done so to opt to present a 1 minute poster presentation - this involves presenting a 1 minutes presentation with 1 accompanying slide to give a brief overview of your poster. Please contact administrator@esaiweb.org by August 31st 2020 if you wish to avail of this opportunity.
- Posters will be presented in a dedicated 30 minute session divided into group themes. Poster presenters will be online during this chaired session to answer any questions on their poster. The session will have opening remarks by a chairperson followed by 1-minute poster presenters and then a rolling powerpoint presentation of all posters featured in the themed session. The session will move then to questions and answers which will be moderated by the session chair.
- All posters will be available online on a rolling powerpoint carousel for the duration of the conference.
- Posters must be emailed in jpeg format to Caoimhe O'Broin conference@esaiweb.org by 5pm Tuesday 6th October 2020. Please be aware of what your poster content will look like online when designing your poster.
- There will be six dedicated poster sessions during the colloquium.
- Each poster is assigned to one of the following themes;

- The Food-Energy-Water Nexus
- Wastewater and Water Reuse
- Waste Management
- A Cleaner Energy future: Energy Production & Storage Options
- Climate Change
- Invasive Species
- Environmental Management, Policy and Communication
- Human Health and the Environment
- Ecotoxicology
- Air Quality and Urban Development
- Marine and Coastal
- Sustainable Transport
- Sustainable Infrastructure and the Built Environment
- Sustainable Land Use, Agriculture and the Food Industry
- Biodiversity and Ecosystems
- Technology and the Environment
- Ireland 2050 - A Resilient Society living within Planetary Boundaries

Student presenters should be aware that a competition is run by the ESAI for the best student poster. The winner will be invited to submit an article on their research project to the ESAI Website and the ESAI E-Zine 'Environews' and will also receive publicity from their sponsor. The prizes confirmed to date are below with more specialist categories to follow:

- The ESAI Best Poster Presentation (€250) sponsored by the Environmental Sciences Association of Ireland (ESAI)

Poster Preparation

- Posters should be submitted in JPeg format.
- Posters should provide the name of the presenter(s) and their affiliation and contact details.
- Posters should include a short description of the research theme and methods used as well as results and the current status of the research as well as the expected outcomes/output.
- Pictures, photographs and diagrams may be included, but please be conscious of file size.
- Poster presenters are encouraged to include on their poster a website address (URL) where ENVIRON delegates can find further information about their research.

Poster Presenters doing a 1 minute oral presentation should adhere to the following guidelines

- At on-line registration stage poster presenters have been invited to do a 1 minute oral presentation.

- The oral presentation should be one slide only. We will not accept more than 1 slide. The one slide should not be one poster!!
- Do not exceed the 1 minute allocation – **the 1 minute time will be strictly enforced.**
- In designing your single slide, consider summarising your research as a graphical abstract.
- The single slide presentation should be sent to conference@esaiweb.org by **5pm Tuesday October 6th. We will not accept presentations after this date.**
- Please test your files for viruses before submitting.
- All presenters will be emailed with details instructions in early October about the technical and housekeeping aspects to their session – how to share screens etc.
- To help get the most from Environ 2020 as a poster presenter be aware that opportunities such as; uploading your biography to the presenters section in the Whova app and attending virtual coffee breaks held through the event in session theme(s) that touch on your own research are a great way to connect with researchers in your field.
